Celebrating Fifteen Years of Community Integration Efforts

This year we celebrate the 15th Anniversary of the Supreme Court's 1999 decision in *Olmstead v. L.C.*, which requires states to ensure that people with disabilities receive services in the most integrated setting appropriate to their needs under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). By recognizing the rights of people with disabilities to access the supports and services necessary to remain in their own homes and communities, rather than in institutions, *Olmstead* breathed new life into the ADA's Integration Mandate. As DOJ continues to enforce the Supreme Court's *Olmstead* decision, we take this opportunity to recognize and reflect upon the progress that has been made so far.
